

Postdoc Ethics Course

The objective of this course is to provide an understanding of the ethical issues that face scientists during the conduct of biomedical research, including data acquisition and presentation of results, both written and oral. Class participation, generally involving ethical scenarios, is mandatory.

Classes will be held for 1.5 hr sessions, once per week, from 8:30 – 10:00 am on Monday mornings for six successive weeks. Sessions will be held in Room 7-201 in the Medical School B building.
